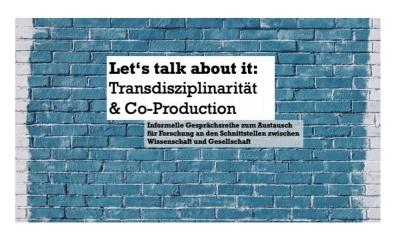
Submit your **proposals for sessions and workshops** by **May 28**. A second step in July/August will be open for applications for lectures, posters, exhibits, and performances.

Update | **Blog Post** | **Transdisciplinary Research** and its **Scientific Impact**

The final report from the tdAcademy fellow group "Transdisciplinary Research and its Scientific Impact" investigates how transdisciplinary research (TDR) influences scientific knowledge production, particularly within sustainability and health research. Through bibliometric analyses and workshops, the study identifies key research communities and highlights that TDR is predominantly applied in isolated clusters, suggesting untapped potential for interdisciplinary integration. The findings underscore the need for enhanced collaboration between sustainability and health research to fully leverage TDR's capacity to address complex societal challenges.
